On September 16, 2022, the victim died as a result of his injuries.

An upgraded charge of 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree Murder was presented against the suspect, who remains in custody at BSO Main Jail.

On September 13, 2022 at 7:10 a.m., officers responded to a 9-1-1 medical call regarding a patient within South Florida State Hospital who was possibly experiencing a cardiac arrest. When officers arrived, they observed the victim in medical distress with injuries to his head.

Pembroke Pines Fire-Rescue transported the victim to Memorial Regional Hospital for assessment and treatment, as the investigation continued. The victim's injuries warranted further investigation by our Robbery Homicide Unit (RHU).

Investigators determined that another patient at South Florida State Hospital, 63-year-old Alexander Ramseur, intentionally battered the victim, resulting in his injuries.

The suspect was arrested, and transported to BSO Main Jail on attempted homicide charges. The victim remains at Memorial Regional Hospital in critical condition.
