### **INCIDENT SUMMARY:**

Pembroke Pines police officers have taken a 15-year-old student into custody after it was determined that he made electronic threats against Charles W. Flanagan High School.

On the evening of January 29, 2025, the suspect was participating in a Snapchat group conversation with other students when he made threats to “shoot up” Flanagan High School. The threat of violence caused alarm for one of the students who contacted 9-1-1. Officers quickly identified the suspect, and Threat Assessment Team members responded to his residence.

It was determined that the suspect is a 10<sup>th</sup> grade student at South Broward High School. The suspect was taken into custody on a felony charge of Electronic Threats to Kill (Florida State Statute 836.10) and transported to the Juvenile Assessment Center.
